



NYC Ferry continues to break ridership records with 3.1 million rides over the summer, and a new single-day record of 49,333 rides. The Soundview and Lower East Side routes celebrated their one-year anniversary. Three new 350-passenger vessels were delivered and put into service.

NYC Ferry responded to a Con Edison power outage on July  $14^{\rm th}$  with additional service from East 34th Street. The UN General Assembly from September 22-27 caused temporary closures of Pier 11/Wall Street and suspended service on the Midtown Shuttle Bus and on the Astoria and Soundview routes for most of the day on Tuesday, September  $24^{\rm th}$ .

<sup>1</sup>On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of stops made within the quarter that depart no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times. This report includes delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. <sup>2</sup>Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use; NYCF Partners with other operators to charter vessels at times of high demand. <sup>3</sup>NYCF operates to Governors Island on weekends during its public season. Figure includes average ridership on weekends when service operated in Q2. <sup>4</sup>Governors Island ridership is included in this figure.
