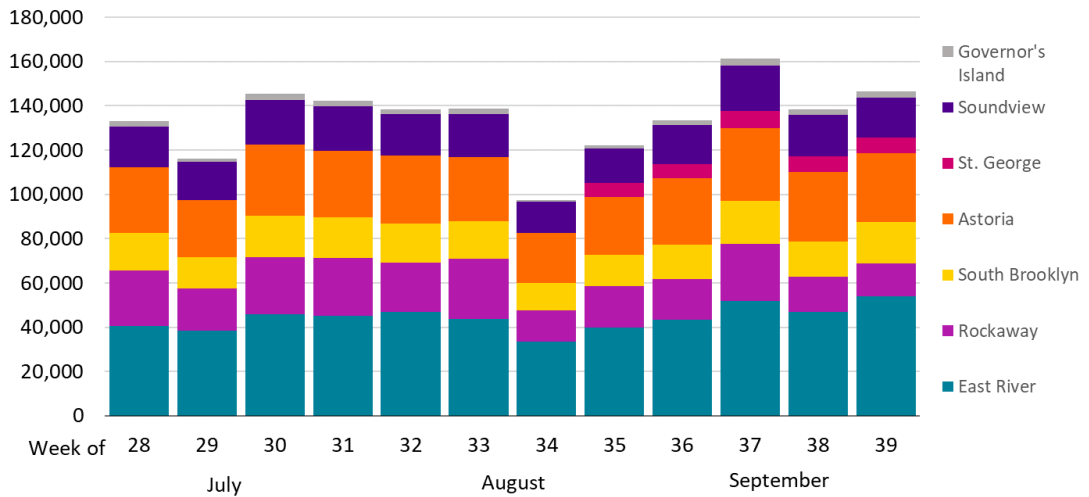

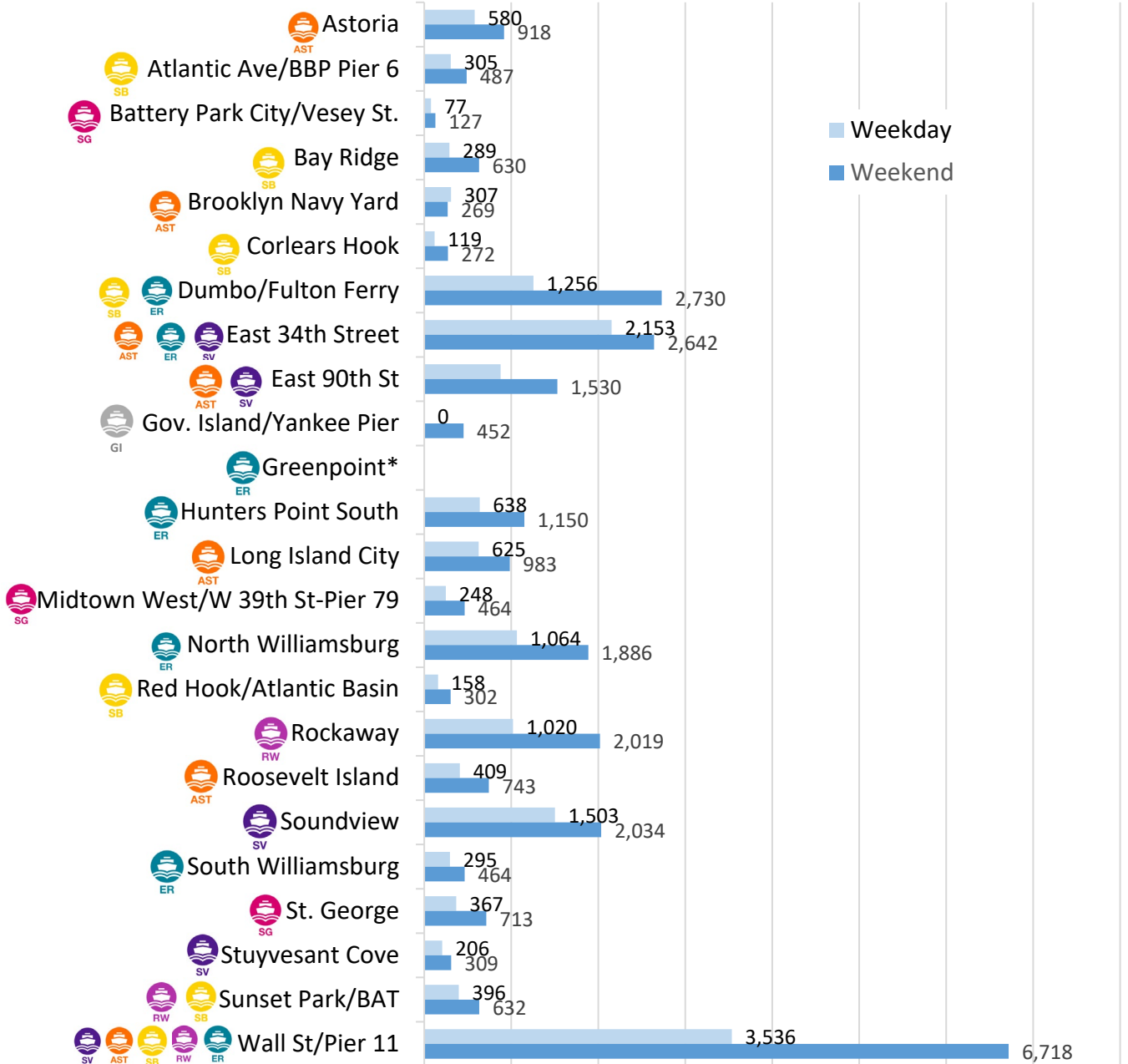

🔔 Service Notes

With good summer weather and more people returning to school and the office in September, NYC Ferry Q3 ridership rose to over 80% of 2019 levels by the quarter's end. NYC Ferry increased service levels during Sukkot and provided Yiddish speaking liaisons at landings with higher ridership during the holiday.

The St. George route launched August 23rd. The Greenpoint landing remained closed in Q3. The fall schedule began on September 13th. The UN General Assembly in September interrupted 40 ferry trips.

¹On Time Performance is calculated as the percentage of trips that departed no more than 1 minute before and arrive no more than 5 minutes past their scheduled times at each landing. This report does not include delays due to events outside of the control of NYC Ferry, such as vessel traffic, river closures/obstructions, extreme weather conditions, and other U.S. Coast Guard restrictions. When tracking devices are offline, the stops are excluded from the calculation. ²Number of NYCF-branded vessels available for use.
